Case studies for reflection and discussion

- 1. Mary is 18 years old and grew up going to church. She has now moved to university and connected with the Christian union, but she is currently looking for a church. She doesn't know many people in the new town and has never lived away from her parents before. How would you welcome Mary in your church?
- 2. John is 19 years old and he grew up in a family that had no faith. He has now moved to university and started reading a Bible his friend gave him. His flatmates are exploring faith too. They'd like to try church. How would you welcome John and his flatmates in your church?
- 3. Ben is 19 years old and grew up going to the same church with his mum. He has felt left out when most of his friends went off to university somewhere else and he is still in the same small town living with his mum. He has a job in a local restaurant but is struggling to see what else is there for him. He is confused about the future and left wondering if what he was told about 'God has a plan for you' is really true. He is not even sure if his faith is true at this stage. How would you support Ben in your church?
- 4. Fola is 20 years old, and she has been studying in the city during the week. She is a Jesus-follower and would like to be part of church, but she works in a supermarket on Saturdays and Sundays. How would you support Fola in her faith journey?
- 5. A new family has moved to the area. They are a couple in their late 20's and early 30's and they have two children aged 2 and 4. They are looking for social activities for their children and for them as a family. After a miscarriage the couple became more interested in faith. How would you support them?
- 6. Carol and Adam are in their late 20's. They both grew up in a Christian family, but in their teens stopped going to church. They got together and moved to a rural town where life costs are more affordable, and they are close to the outdoors which they enjoy. After a couple of mental health issues and reconnecting with their Christian friends, they are considering faith again. How would you reach them?

- 7. Ben and Leah are in their early 30's and they don't feel like they belong to the 18-35's group at church because they are married with small children. They would love to connect with others but evening gatherings don't work for them. However, they meet up with their non-Christian neighbours who also have small children for playdates every week. How would you support them in their Christian journey and mission?
- 8. The Smiths have been part of the church for their whole lives, they're in their 60's now and have grown-up children in the 18-35's age range. Even though their children grew up in church, they now only attend occasional church services and are not regulars. These young adults are both facing work and relational challenges and feel a bit lost and detached from church and faith. How would you seek to engage with them missionally?
- 9. Damilola is a talented worship leader in her 20's. For a long time, she's been dreaming of hosting a worship outreach event for people her age. The leaders in her church say that they have done similar things before and that it hasn't worked in the past. She feels she lacks the support to try something different that could really help her reach her peers. What advice would you give to her church leaders?
- 10. Streams Baptist Church has about four people in the 18-35's age range. They have different vocations and struggle to find a time to meet together weekly. However, they all have people around them that are curious about faith. They would love to invite them to church but can't think of an event or service that their peers might engage with. How would you support them to be more missional?
